I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of Your Lordship's despatch No. 189 of the 16th April last regarding Mr. L.G. Bandford's application for employment in the East Africa or Uganda Protectorates.

Mr. Bandford has submitted the application which I enclose herewith.

The Commissioner of Works reports that Mr. Bandford is purely a mechanical engineer, and as such he has no work to offer him, though he appears to know his work well. The Manager of the Uganda Railway also has no work he could offer him. Under these circumstances there is I fear little hope of his finding the employment he seeks in this Protectorate.
