Mr Ellis.

Mr Powell called this morning. He proposes to sail in Dec. for Bombay, to visit Madras, Calcutta, and the India Govt. Agricultural stations, and Ceylon. His tour would last two or three months in all, after which he would return direct to E.A. He would make himself familiar with Indian methods, but his main object would be to collect plants and seeds of cocoa and other economic products, which would be packed under his personal care for use in the Agricultural Dept. of E.A.P. His total expenses for travelling and subsistence would amount to £125 to £140; he has taken a provisional ticket which will save part of the cost of passages. He

does not press for salary in excess of that ordinarily allowed during leave. He asks for facilities from the Indian and Ceylon Govts.

We can hardly estimate his subsistence expenditure accurately, & it would I think be better, if the proposal is accepted, to give him actual travelling expenses ^{of travel} plus a fixed daily allowance.

? ask him to submit in writing an estimate of the cost of passages, travelling, &c. Tell him to consult the C.A. if necessary.
