My Lord,

With reference to Your Lordship's despatch

No. 452 of the 1th ultmo. Please the honour to transmit

herewith a memorandum by the Post Master General on the  
subject of the employment of female postal clerks.

2. Your Lordship will observe that Mr. Gosling would  
be glad to avail himself of the service of female  
clerks but that he is unwilling to do this if it  
entails the reduction of the number of probationers  
under training, and that he cannot arrive at a definite  
decision until he knows if his staff estimates for  
the next financial year have met with Your Lordship's  
approval.

S. In these circumstances and in view of the  
fact that the Postal service is undoubtedly  
suffering from want of competent clerks and  
telegraphists the course suggested by Mr. Gosling  
in the third paragraph of his memorandum would

The Secretary,

The position is that we are at present short of telegraphers from India and are awaiting for the local training of probationers from Seychelles and Mauritius. It will probably be 5 years before these become really efficient officers - until the meantime the service will suffer from a lack of a due number of qualified telegraphists. Measures are taken. It was suggested by Mr. ... that I proposed the engagement of white females telegraphists.

I could see some difficulty of supplying the immediate & if requirements whilst the probationers are under training, I would avail myself of it as although there is point in favour of the employment of females they are bound to give a certain amount of trouble. A further point is that unless my staff estimates for the ensuing financial year are passed as submitted the service of white females would only be possible by unduly reducing the number of probationers under training, which would be unkind from the point of view of future requirements.

In all the circumstances I suggest that the Imperial Post Office be asked to give an expression of opinion on the general question dealing particularly with the rates of pay and the terms of employment, also as to whether established female telegraphists of the

Home

Home Service could be seconded for 3 years service in East Africa. If this were done and the result enabled out, together with an intimation as to what financial provision would be passed next year, I should then be in a position to give a definite answer.

4. Owing to the failure to recruit other clerks there are sufficient funds available to permit of the employment of six female telegraphists - 3 from the 1st of February next, but their emplacement could not be continued, together with the training of an adequate number of probelmers unless the estimates for next year are passed as submitted.

I am so. to request that you will inform the P.M.G. that the Gov. of the M.A.P. has put forward proposals for the engagement of a few female postal clerks and telegraphists for temporary service in the P.M.G.

Lord Lawrence will be obliged if the P.M.G. will inform him whether it would be possible to second established female telegraphists of the Home service for three years service in the M.A.P., and if so what rates of pay and conditions of employment it would be necessary to offer them.

I am to transmit to you, for the info. of the P.M.G., a copy of a memorandum embodying the proposals put forward by the Gov. It will be understood that these proposals are at present entirely provisional.
