My Lord,

With reference to Your Lordship's despatch

No. 424 of the 22nd of August last and in continuation

of my former despatch on this subject No. 319 of the

1st of July, I have the honour to submit at the request

of the General Manager, Uganda Railway, letters from

two officers serving on Lake Steamers on the subject

of service on the Lake counting towards "sea time".

2. I venture to think that the Board of Trade

cannot be thoroughly aware of the conditions which

prevail on Lake Victoria, and I trust that Your Lord-

ship will therefore be willing to make further repre-

sentations in the matter.

3. The present President of the Board of Trade

is personally acquainted with the special conditions

Sir,

In continuation of previous copy forwarded you
regarding the service of officers on vessels on Lake Victoria, I have the honor to transmit herewith a letter
which I have received from Mr. Hampden, an officer of
the s.s. "CLARENCE HILL".

I would venture to enclose Mr. Hampden's request that the Board of Trade may be once more consulted
on the matter and I would suggest that the following
points should be laid before them.

- (a) the class of vessels which run this flight.
- (b) the rough weather to which they are often sub-
ject.
- (c) the intricate navigation of the 600 miles water
through which those boats are invariably
traveling.
- (d) the constant working of these steamer along
2 miles and away from the piers at the dif-
ferent ports.

I would further venture to ask that it may be
permitted to have to trade "under the orders of
the Commandant" on vessels of a similarly similar

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to those performed on any ordinary ocean-going steamer with the exception that the greater supervision and care is necessary owing to the numerous ports of call.

Should the Board of Trade still decline to allow service on these boats to count for time, I have the honor to ask if it would be possible to transfer Mr. Hampden temporarily to the s.s. "WIND", and at some time on that steamer would be allowed to count.

Under existing circumstances the loss of Mr. Hampden in these waters is a most serious loss to his and he would in his own interests be compelled to vacate his present appointment and transfer his services to a vessel with ocean-going steamer in order to obtain his master's certificate.

I should appreciate the loss of his services to our service and I consider him to be in every respect a thorough good and efficient officer.

Sir,

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt
of your letter No. 3549/17 of the 1st September enclosing
copies of certain correspondence between the Colonial
Office and Board of Trade concerning my request that my
services here on Lake Victoria as officer on the railway
steamers should count "as" of time towards enabling me
to sit for an ordinary Board of Trade Master's certifi-
cate.

2. In reply may I venture to say that the matter
may be again laid before the Board of Trade or the Pres-
ident of the Board and that it may be pointed out that
not only no work done is "as" likely as that done
in "dry dock" vessels, any of which are not the least
useful in which I am now serving.

3. I would submit in case the Board of Trade
not allow the terms of my service here to count for the
above purpose, that I must be permitted to count half
the time spent there as the A.M. until recommended
for service on the lake to Seaford as one month at sea.

If this be not permitted it would mean that every day I served here is so much time wasted owing to my inability to hold convictions sufficiently high to warrant my ever being given a command with any measure of safety to my ship.

4. In conclusion I would venture to add that I have already some months of "sea time" served at sea for the above purpose so that it is not as if all the time would be served on the lake. Furthermore under different circumstances I should remain here for two years or I would take as little in any case to sit for examination the first period; I would therefore point out that by the date on which I would present myself for examination my experience would be much increased.
