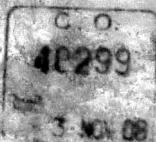

With ref. to your letter of the 7th Oct., no. 16945/08, I am &c. to transmit to you ^a copy of telegraphic corresp. with the Gov. of the L.A.P. on the subject of the water supply of Nairobi,

it will be seen from the asp. of which a copy is enclosed that the inadequacy of the existing water supply ^{is a grave} ~~is a grave~~ ~~danger to the public health~~ ~~for Nairobi~~, therefore, the Lords of the Treasury feel unable to assent to the temporary diversion of Railway funds for the purpose of increasing the supply, Lord Crewe has no alternative, in view of the urgency of the matter, but to ask that the gross authorized expenditure for the year may be exceeded by the amount required.

I am to add with ref. to the 4th para. of your letter under reply that Capital Sanction no. 15 is that allocated to Minor Bridges, to the credit of which an unexpended balance of £, 101, 22s remained on the 31st March, as their Lordships will see on reference to p. 30 of the last Railway Report.

4. Lord Crewe will enquire of the Gov. how the payments for water supplies by the Railway Dept. have been brought to account,
