The rain water tanks are being provided with hand pumps which will obviate the necessity of drawing water by dipping buckets through the trap doors, thus allowing ingress and egress to Mosquitoes, and the Public Works Department has been asked to inspect all tanks with a view to making them Mosquito proof.

2. Bush clearing has been carried on and extended.
3. Provision is being made for the erection of Public Latrines in native quarters.
4. I understand another refuse destructor is to be provided.
5. The liability to contamination of the wells can only be remedied by introducing a gravitation water supply and filling them in. In some instances they also breed mosquitoes, but being mostly public wells it would not be possible to keep them adequately covered.
