Jeaffreson, Clerk in the Bombay Agency of the East Africa Protectorates, returning to India I beg to say that the abscess of the liver from which he was and may ^{be} still suffering was of climatic origin and might very readily, though not necessarily, recur under similar climatic conditions. Considering his health for some years and his present state I do not advise his return to India or the tropics even if he ultimately makes a satisfactory recovery from his present illness.
