Case of Captain Wright

When I met you in consultation in this case to-day you requested me to send you a written statement of my opinion of it. I have now the pleasure to do so.

I am of opinion that Captain Wright is the subject of a tumour within the chest; that the disease is one of the greatest gravity, and renders his life altogether insecure, sudden death being a possible termination of it; and that he is unfit to resume the responsible duty of captain of a steamer.
