We are rather troubled by your letter of 2nd April 5814/08 as to the pension of Murray. Murray you will remember has broken down from repeated attacks of malarial fever and gastritis.

The medical report states this and that he was at times not judicious in the use of alcohol. With gastritis of course any use of alcohol would be injudicious. The principal medical officer when asked for a special report cannot estimate the extent of the effect of alcohol on the gastritis but ways it should here been entirely avoided. There is no record of Murray s even having come under medical treatment for alcoholism.

It is quite possible that a man out in the wilds suffering from the extreme prostration of gestritis wight increase his use of alcohol not knowing that it was the worst wing he could do. The man does not appear to have been a drukard. He has never been treated for alcoholism nor are there any reports against him to that effect. But the Covernor says "it has been generally known that "Mr Murray was at times addicted to the immoderate use of alcohol". This the Covernor knew from unofficial and private sources at the time the malaria and gastritis were at their height.

Your letter speaks of the practice here. Is it really the case that a man's pension he e would be reduced on the strength of private and unofficial reports that he drank too much, when he had never been publicly drunk or seen drunk in office hours?

If so of course there is a precedent for due b ing sion Bireay likewise, but I am afraid that an injusay be done to a sick man in this particular case.
