In reply to your letter of the 10th ultimo (4357/1908), I am directed by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury to state that, subject to the general observations contained in Their letter of the 1st instant (4030/08), They agree to the estimate for the Survey Department of the East Africa Protectorate as modified by Secretary the Earl of Elgin, provided that his Lordship is satisfied that a smaller scale for the topographical survey, say  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch, would not suffice, and be more economical as the standard.
