Sir,

I have the honour to transmit to you herewith the leave and last pay certificate of Mr. E. C. Foot, Assistant Conservator of Forests, together with a copy of the proceedings of a Medical Board held for the purpose of reporting on this officer's state of health.

2. Mr. Foot who is, on a two years agreement, has been incapacitated from work for some months. As his illness was contracted in the execution of his duty by repeated wettings experienced while surveying the forests during the rainy season, I have the honour to recommend that he be treated as generously as possible, and I would suggest that he be given the six months' leave proposed by the

 that his services be dispensed with as it is evident he
