Sir,

In reply to Mr. Cox's letter (27516/1908) of the 12th instant, I am to say, for the information of the Earl of Crews, that the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury agree that Mr. Stedman and Mr. Macnaghten, Assistant Engineers in the Public Works Department of the East of England Protectorate, may be offered permanent pensionable posts provided that the Secretary of State is satisfied that this addition does not exceed the number of pensionable posts authorized by the permanent requirements of the Department.

It is to be considered that the salary of Mr. Stedman should, in consideration of the present value of pension rights, be fixed at a point below the scale of this profession, say £2,300, which would be the rate for Mr. Macnaghten. I suggest that they should be placed on a scale of £2,300 to £300 by an annual increment of £10 (which is appropriate to a pensionable scale in this respect), and that they should be allowed to enter the scale at the point to which they would have attained had they been placed on this scale on appointment in 1905.
