Sir,

In reply to Mr. Cox's letter (27516/1908) of the 12th instant, I am to say, for the information of the Earl of Crews, that the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury agree that Mr. Stedman and Mr. Macnaghten, Assistant Engineers in the Public Works Department of the East African Protectorate, may be offered permanent pensionable posts provided that the Secretary of State is satisfied that this addition will not affect the permanent requirements of the service.

It is considered that the salary of £1000, which is at present fixed, is in consideration of the present value of pension rights being fixed at a point below the minimum of this present scale of £6 - £300, which would be fair for such a sum.

The Lords Commissioners suggest that they should be placed on a scale commencing at £300 by an increment of £10 (which is appropriate to a pensionable scale in scope), and that they should be allowed to enter the same at the point to which they would have attained had they been placed on this scale on appointment in 1905.
