I have laid before the Board of Directors of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Anthonis's account of the instant case (39802/1908) and its enclosure further detailing the costs in the Charlesworth appeal case.

In reply I am to say that regard being had to the circumstances now explained, and in view of the opinion of the Earl of Crewe that there is little prospect of obtaining a better offer, My Lords agree that the sum of £200 now tendered by Messrs. Rawle Johnstone and Company in satisfaction of the claim of His Majesty's Government may be accepted.

In reply to Mr. Antreas's letter of the instant (36982/1908), I am directed by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury to request the Earl of Crews that They agree to the appointment of an additional native clerk in the office of the Secretary at Bombay for the British Protectorates in Africa at a salary of Rs. 80 to Rs. 100 a month.
