Sir,

With reference to my complaints re Administration of Justice in B.E.A. in my letter of August 18th 08.

I beg to state that Judge A. Bonham Carter was formerly a Magistrate or an A.R.M. in the Transvaal, and that he resigned from that position.

I have been informed that the Solicitor General, of the Transvaal, advised the Governor to dispense with his services, on the grounds of incompetence. And that the Governor induced Mr. A. Bonham Carter to send in his resignation.

I did not mention this in the letter of August 18th as I had no official evidence as to the truth of the statement, but if my information is correct, if a Judge of the East African Court was not competent to discharge the duties of a Magistrate in the Transvaal, I think I can reasonably ask that the Governor be informed of that fact.
