I bog to thank you for your letter of July loth. It was not intention in my letter of June seth to propose that an individual or Corporation holding more than one lease should be entirely exempted from the obligation of developing both of them in an adequate manner, and I should read Mr Churchill's note "When the Lesses of more than one helding is paying proper attention to one of them he should be exempt with regard to the other", as having the intention to lay down the principle that provided that he is paying proper attention to one he should receive rather special treatment regarding the other and should not be unduly pressed, and I think this would be found of benefit to the Colony as well as to the Lasses, and though I have only my own againson as my reason for saying so, I should imagine that this would have been the intention of Mr Charchill.

Is it too much for me to ask that attention may be drawn to this point while the New Lend Ordinance is under densideration?
