Dear Sir,

I am taking the liberty of writing you to ask you to emphasize a certain point in connection with the appeal -  
Wambo and others v Brown

It is a point which I did not notice when conducting the case which your father does not seem to have noticed but as it has since been suggested to me by a medical man I do not like to risk its being disregarded by Counsel in England as it may have very far-reaching consequences.

Vide Muller Ward's evidence He says "The gun was loaded the barrel the right had been discharged." If this shows suicide it can explain very well what a lot of pains was taken to help Myombo who was known to be last in the company of the deceased man. As the charms given to Myombo I might say that it is a very common thing for people here to be wearing charms and the to have a property of protecting the wearer from harm. Yesin from the Koran seems to be believed. Anyways a charm is always worn to ward off danger or hurt from the wearer and for no other reason. For instance my boys both have Yesin charms about them put on during a period of severe illness.

The lower jaw of the deceased man was missing ( Evidence of  
Alexander Robertson M.D.C.B.S )

If the deceased man had finished his shooting he would have  
emptied both the barrels of his gun and if he were still going  
to shoot he would have had both barrels loaded

I hope I shall not be considered to be writing unnecessary  
instructions but the circumstance having been emphatically  
suggested to me I think it my duty to make sure that it is  
suggested ( even at this late stage ) to Counsel

I write to you personally as it would be an unnecessary  
delay in my opinion to just write this to your father for in  
any event it would be sent to England I presume through you
