Sir,

I have the honour to report that during the course of the present year three, or four applications have been received from gentlemen desirous of obtaining the sole right to prospect over certain areas for a given period with a view to selecting a block of land within those areas and working the minerals found thereon in accordance with the provisions of "The Mining Regulations, 1908". It was the wish of the late Commissioner to enter into an agreement with these prospectors, a copy of which I enclose herewith. This form, you will observe, is practically similar to the one contained in the Marques

AN AGREEMENT made the day of one
the thousand nine hundred and , between SIR DONALD STEWART
K. C. M. G., His Majesty's Commissioner for the East Africa
Protectorate (hereinafter called the Commissioner), of
the one part, and

of the other part.

1. The Commissioner hereby grants to an exclusive right to prospect for gold and other minerals and precious stones, over the area of land more particularly described in the Schedule and plan hereto annexed, not exceeding square miles, for a period of months from the date hereof, and will direct the Commissioner of Mines, or the officer in charge for the time being of the Department of Mines to issue a permit (hereinafter called the permit) for the said prospecting rights.
 2. The permit shall be in writing, shall state the name of the person under whose direct charge the prospecting is to be carried out, and shall be in force for months from the date of this Agreement, during which period the Commissioner will not allow any other person or persons to prospect for gold and other minerals and precious stones within the said area without the consent of Any change of the person under whose direct charge the prospecting is to be carried out shall be notified to the Commissioner.
 3. There shall be paid to the Commissioner a fee of £ 25 in respect of the permit.
 4. The permit shall confer no right on

for a period of 20 years or until the
mines have a value of over one million
pounds of gold and other minerals and
precious stones have been obtained
and 20 per cent of the same
is sold for our foreign market
and 20 per cent is retained
for the exploration of such lands
as may surround the same and that
in exchange a lease of the said
land of any part thereof of precious
stones as specified,

to take and carry away any minerals or precious stones
except as samples and for the purpose of making investigations as to their exploitation.

5. Agree to give to the Commissioner information as to any minerals or precious stones found in the said area, the benefit of all surveys of the said area, and generally to place at his disposal all the information they possess that may be of value for the development of the Protectorate.

6. All the operations of ~~the~~, whether under the permit or the lease, shall be carried out in accordance with the mining law in force for the time being in the Protectorate, and agree to be bound by the provisions of "The Mining Regulations, 1902" and any Rules thereunder, or of any Ordinance substituted therefor, even if the land contained in the said area or lease has been exempted from the operation of these Regulations.

8. Provided always that nothing herein shall affect the rights

rights of natives or third parties in or over any part of
the surface of the lands comprised in the said area or leases.
