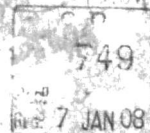

With reference to your letter of yesterday date. — *
 I would just like to express an impression that has come to me
 that the Home Trading Company designed, just on two applications
 made already, a fair price and value, a that of their
 application a doctor they intended to apply before the fact of
 the Toronto last year published. This is not exactly not
 the case. The first intention of the Home Trading Company was
 to buy some shares... some in the future and with them
 the permission to trade it. When the true value of the investment
 was discovered the scheme was abandoned. It was become
