Sir,

With reference to your Despatch No. 19, Public, dated the 3rd February 1905, regarding the reduction of the establishment maintained by the Professor of Emigration at Karachi for work connected with the emigration and repatriation of coolies recruited for the Uganda Railway, we have the honour to forward a copy of a letter on the subject which has been received from the Government of Bombay. We consider that a further reduction of the establishment is not feasible at present, and support the contention that it is necessary to retain the senior clerk.

2. We invite attention to paragraph 3 of the letter, and would request that arrangements may be made for the payment by the Uganda Railway of the establishment which it is deemed necessary to retain, until such time as its abolition is sanctioned by the Local Government.
