We must have answers to these questions. We will take into any useful letter to Mr. C. and we should make the comparison of telegraph lines also. I doubt when we can confidently apply pressure without the actual document before us.

But compare by telegraph, ask for a copy of the agreement or lease by telegraph. We should also see to the telegraph. Mr. C. will of course refuse to permit the transfer of any further funds to Mr. C. pending the settlement.
