The amount provided in the  
Vote for Colonial Service as a grant  
in Aid of the Postmaster for the  
current year is £125,000. As the  
Provision will be drawn against  
the grant, letter (No 4601/09) of the  
10th May last, the actual amount  
to be used would, in normal circumstances,  
be some £11,500 less than the figure,  
or £113,500, & this sum has already  
been issued in full to meet expenditure  
incurred in the country in behalf of  
the Postmaster by the Colon Agents for  
the Colonies. It will be seen from  
the accompanying enclosure, however, that  
although there is no reason to think  
that the reduced grant will be  
sufficient to meet the Postmaster's requirements,

taking the year as a whole, some  
difficulties may be experienced in
