My Lord,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of Your Lordship's despatch No. 479 of the 14th of August last, with reference to certain concessions held by the London and South African Agency Limited (in liquidation).

2. Mr. Holman James to whom it is proposed to transfer the concession is at present in England, and as I am unable to obtain locally any satisfactory statement as to his financial status, I would suggest for Your Lordship's consideration that the negotiations for the transfer should be carried on in England.

3. I do not consider that it is essential that an assignee of these concessions should be required to deposit any sums as a guarantee of his intention and ability to work the concessions, but Your Lordship will doubtless insist upon Mr. Holman James or any other proposed assignee producing satisfactory proof that the concession will be worked within a reasonable time and in a bona fide manner, either by himself or by some company ready and

and willing to accept a transfer of the leases  
from him.

4. Should it become clear that Mr. Holman  
James wishes to obtain the assignment of the  
lease to himself merely in the hope that he may  
find some persons willing to purchase his interests  
therein, I think that he should be informed that  
the assignment cannot be sanctioned.
