SECRET CIRCULAR
LONDON, S.W.

Sir,

I have the honour to transmit to you a copy of a letter handed to Mr. L.H. Seaford by the East Africa Protectorate authorities, the original of which we have not yet received, relative to his visit to America on leave of absence.

Mr. Seaford was delayed for some time at Naples owing to an attack of fever and states that he received an advance of 212 lire from the British Consul at that place to enable him to come to the land.

On his arrival in this country, Mr. Seaford requested that at the expiration of his leave he should be granted a period of a week or two days to go to America.

He has now been granted a period of three weeks.

Dear General,

I am directed by His Majesty's Government and
Commander in chief to advise herewith the General Officer whose
Mr. L. H. Seaford has been engaged locally at various times
on the subordinate staff of this Headquarters.

Mr. Seaford has been paid his salary up to and
including the 10th July 1906 and in consideration of his
having arranged for the payment of his leave salary 1906
will not be entitled to draw any further salary until the
expiration of his leave. Mr. Seaford's desire of
spending his leave in America and in accordance with the
Regulations which govern the Subordinate Establishment he
is allowed the cost of a return passage provided that
at our passage does not exceed the cost of a second
class return passage to London.

As Mr. Seaford is desirous of travelling to
via Paris a more direct route than via London it has been
arranged accordingly to grant him the equivalent of a second
class passage to London in eight days and I am to request that a
suitable number of men may be sent for duty from London
