Sir,  
I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of  
Her Majesty's Treasury No. C. 1189, dated 25th June  
(24774/1909), on the subject of the provision of funds to  
meet the expenditure in this territory of the East Africa  
Protectorate during the remainder of the present financial  
year.

I am to request that you will be good enough to inform the Earl  
of Salisbury what in the circumstances he has agreed that a  
portion of the total amount, £11,500, of the grant  
in Aid actually provided for the present year, that is to  
say, the sum of £11,500, which was the Treasury Order  
of 10th May last (4601/09) is available for expenditure  
by the Protectorate, may now be repaid to the Treasury by  
temporary advances, on the understanding that as soon  
as receipts of the same nature have been received the  
question of repayment should be dealt with.
