Sir

With reference to the arrangements by which
the Government of the Anglo-Egyptian Sudan
undertake to bear a proportion of the expenses
of the above Commission in respect of the
joint demarcation of the Sudan Abyssinian
Frontier between the Atoka R. and the 6th
Parallel N.L. I have the honour to call
attention to my reports of even date, on the
work carried out by the Commission and the
description of the frontier attached thereto.

From them it will be seen that,
owing to the boundary in the section referred
to being thrown into a stream whose
course was already sufficiently surveyed,
Draha's work was necessary in Sudan
territory & certainly he is to be
considered purely on behalf of the Sudan Government.

I would therefore suggest that you
should not be called on to contribute anything
to him as a "mandate" being in the estimate
sent to Imperial Funds for
the honor of the
