In reply to your letter Number 30265
I have the honour to append the names
and addresses of the three Brothers selected
to fill vacancies on the staff of priests
in British East Africa.

I should add that the selection of these
men has entailed considerable correspondence
and work. As vacancies are certain
to arise hereafter I have judged it useful
to append a list registering the names
of those candidates who appear suitable
for future employment, and I have
put into separate lists those who have
been interviewed and those who as
far as can be judged appear suitable
but whom I have not yet had an opportunity
of interviewing. I have received some two
hundred and fifty applications for these
vacancies of which about two hundred
have to be seriously considered. It is evident
that there is no difficulty in obtaining
priests on the terms offered and it may
be a question whether the commencing
Salary of the priest who is now on
expenses plan-table should not be
£100 instead of £120.
