Have the favour to acknowledge the receipt of the letter of the 1st instant No. 2014/1905 conveying the Secretary of State's approval of the proposed design for the new notes for the East Africa and Uganda Protectorates.

2. We have not yet however received the Secretary of State's approval of the paper on which it is proposed the notes should be printed. A specimen was enclosed in the letter of the 6th March addressed to the Foreign Office but was not returned to us with your letter of the 6th April No. 2014/1905 without remark. I therefore again enclose it and have to request that you may receive instructions on this point as early as possible so as to prevent any delay in the printing of the notes.

I have also to request that you will be good enough to send me the value of the notes to be printed.
