of the 27th inst. which
showing that he was
dangerously ill with
fever in Wombourne hospital.
His Lordship learned
from the report com-
municated to you
in the letter from His
Office of the 8th inst.
that your son was taken
to hospital on the 27th
of Dec^r, that the first
diagnosis of his illness
was malaria, and that
the diagnosis of enteric
complicating malaria
was not doubtfully
established until the
16th of Jan^r 1894.
