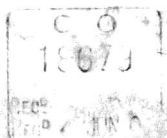

Sir,
I have the honour to request a grant
from the Government or the East Africa Protectorate
Government to assist the publication of
a Shosha grammar which I have written.
I sent up for and passed the Government
examination in Lus & Malakha Kavaranda
and Mr. Kibby recommended that I should
publish my grammatical notes. I
have got a volume ready for publication
consisting of about 26000 words text
and 3000 definitions in vocabularies.

The Cambridge University Press to which
the MS. was submitted could not in
the state of the funds undertake the
publication of an uncommensurate
book of the sort. I am trying to
place the MS. elsewhere but will
probably be unsuccessful for some
reasons so that it is advisable to put
out now the possibility of sale and
condition of Government assistance.
