I have not yet replied to your letter of ... as I had left the matter in Mr. Wilkes' hands to arrange. I understand from him that he has come to certain arrangements with regard to the lease and to the minimum amount to be spent on the property, but I have not heard anything definite, or seen him for over a fortnight. I should esteem it a favour if you would kindly let me know the position of affairs at the present moment, as I have just received a proposal from a company owning land in the same locality to incorporate the £6,000 bonus with their property and provide all the working capital necessary.

With regard to paragraph 4 of your letter, I would like to say that no written despatch is arrived at, for I have no recollection of authorising any such expenditure, and you will see that the first intimation I received was a cablegram.


