Your telegram of 16th May Smith reports Hardinge's pillars give Germans 120 square miles of good country more than they are entitled to. Position of terminal point marked on I.D.W.O. map No. ⁹⁷⁶ (a) is latitude $2^{\circ} 57' 36''$ and longitude $37^{\circ} 31' 12''$. Hardinge's pillar is latitude $2^{\circ} 55' 45''$ and longitude $37^{\circ} 33' 13''$. Agree with Smith in thinking that as the pillars placed by Hardinge without consent of Germans his action cannot be considered binding. Smith does not suggest revision of boundary but that boundary should be definitely marked by International Commission for the first time and I submit that at the present time appears to be most suitable. In any case recommend definite demarcation from Laitokitok to Lake Jipe at the southern end of which the boundary was agreed to in 1892. Discussed question with Governor German East Africa who will arrive in a few days but request that matter be arranged as expeditiously as possible. Smith will finish present work 30th June and if he is to continue survey must make arrangements for feeding his men. He estimates extra work to take two months and if demarcation of boundary to coast should be ordered two months more. Full report by post.
