I have the honour to refer to Mr. Jackson's despatch of May 21st 1908 respecting travelling Allowances and Incremental salaries and to solicit the favour of a reply.

2. I have already had occasion to observe that the position of officers serving in this Protectorate compares very unfavourably from a financial point of view with that of their West African colleagues, - state of things which is not to my mind justified by any considerable divergence, generally speaking, between the climatic and other conditions prevailing on the two coasts.

3. In the interests of the Service as a whole I should cordially welcome an attempt to ameliorate the pay and prospects of East African Officers, particularly those of the Administrative branch.
