There are two difficulties about making
an offer to him

(a) We cannot state definitely the

terms of employment. We should look
to make it the period required for the
construction of the Juba-Rakinde railway
allowing to enable him to form a judgment
that the line will be about 50 miles in
length.

(1) The Niger Dept. who very reasonably
object to parting with him before his
agreement for service on the S. & R. R.
Railway expires. It is important to
imagine, that nothing should be done to
hinder the completion of that line.

If difficulty (1) is removed an offer
of employment as engineer in charge
of construction of the Juba line a sum
at £700 + per. for the period of the contract
should be telegraphed to Mr Collyer
through the Govt of N. Nigeria.
