In N/14741 the CA were authorized to pay salary at the rate of £240 p.a. - id. £200 ~~to~~ + £20 house allowance.
 I have consulted S.R. & C. & find that it is not our practice to allow an officer to draw a proportion of his house allowance on leave:
 nor do the Gold Coast or Nigerian Deptt. ever allow it.
 Presumably an officer who has house all^a on leave to
 his quarters, lives furnished

apartments agrees them up while
on leave - therefore is not
compelled to pay rent for a
house while away. If the
latter were the usual procedure,
I think that there wd. be
a good rel to be said for
allowing the proper proportion
of the house allowance ^{to him} on leave.

As, however, the Ch:dec: does
not indicate that this is the
case, & indeed clearly shows
his own view to be that house
allow. was case, while
spices are on leave -

? ask: say that
Mr. Neillan's case is not to be
considered as a precedent,
+ that an Oficer who is
entitled to house allowance
in his of free quarters
will cease to draw the
allowance for the period
during which he is on leave.
