My Lord,

In my dear [redacted] ^{XCC} that Sir Arthur Hardinge, ~~which~~ ^{in gallo}, the Chief of the Mazrui, entered into an agreement according to the terms of which a sum of £100 per annum was assured to the latter on his retiring from the public service, provided that he was not dismissed and that he surrendered certain rights and royalties. The only copy of this agreement in existence was one in Arabic in Sheikh Rashid's possession, a translation of which I forwarded to

you recently. A fresh search has been made, and the original agreement has not been discovered. It has been registered in the Principal Registrar of Documents at Downing Street, but it lacks, however, the signature of the Government officer. From this document, a copy of which is enclosed, it appears that the Government is under no obligation to pay the pension of £100 per annum.

THIS INDENTURE made this tenth day of January 1899
tliousand eight hundred and ninety nine BETWEEN 223
Rashid bin Salim bin Hamis of Takaungu in the Province
of Seyidie in the East Africa Protectorate, Vali of
Takaungu (hereinafter called the said Vali) of the
one part and Sir Arthur Henry Hardinge, K.C.M.G.,
C.B., Her Majesty's Commissioner and Consul General
for the East Africa Protectorate (hereinafter called
the said Commissioner) of the other part. WITNESSETH
that in consideration of the said Commissioner granting
unto the said Vali a pension of pounds One hundred
sterling per annum for life commencing and to become
payable as and from the date of the said Vali retiring
from the service of the said East Africa Protectorate
for any other reason than dismissal for misconduct,
THE said Vali doth hereby assign transfer and surrender
unto the said Commissioner and his successors in Office,
all those the rights royalties powers authorities and
interests whatsoever and wheresoever of him the said
Vali or of his heirs successors or representatives as
a Chieftain in East Africa TO HOLD the same unto the
said Commissioner and his successors in Office for the
time being absolutely. PROVIDED always and it is
hereby agreed and declared by and between the parties
hereto that in the event of the said Vali alienating
transferring assigning or charging the said pension
hereby granted or doing or suffering any act or thing
whereby the said pension shall be attached or taken in
execution then and immediately thereupon this deed shall
be null and void and the said pension shall not become
or ceased to be payable
payable as the case may be. PROVIDED further and it
is also hereby agreed and declared by and between the
parties hereto that the deed shall

be executed in duplicate whereof one copy shall be written in the English language and the other copy in the Arabic language and in the event of any difference or discrepancy between the two copies the English copy shall prevail,

IN WITNESS whereof the said parties to these present have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first above written.
