My Lord,

With reference to Your Lordship's despatch of July 22th 1909 and other correspondence relating to the installation of Electric light in the bungalows of Nairobi officers, I have the honour to invite an expression of Your Lordship's views on the points which have arisen in connection with the payment of £5 on the original cost by occupiers of quarters in which the light has been installed.

The first of these is the case of officers who are allotted such quarters and do not wish to avail themselves of the light. I would recommend that, when this occurs, the current may be cut off and the £5 remitted.

The second question relates to the disposal of the £5. At present it is retained by Government, but I should prefer to have it handed over to the Native Affairs Department.

Thirdly, and finally. At present repairs are paid for out of the vote for the maintenance of public buildings.
