1. I have referred to my Dispatch No. 56 of
the 1st instant, the instructions to which I referred
in paragraph 1, under the ordinary terms of tenure
which apply to all European officials in the pro-
tectorate, and Foresters F.L.Moon and T.Hawkins,
whose appointments have already been sanctioned in
your Lordships' Despatch No. 56 of the 6th of May
1909 and No. 56 of the 20th of January 1909, and
J.L.Soon, C.H.Mihail and C.Webber, whose appoint-
ments have not, through some inadvertence been
submitted to Your Lordships, though they have been
some years in Government Service.

2. Forester Hawkins has expressed his willing-
ness to accept the new conditions of service on
his return from his home leave which will be in
February 1911, and does much credit to him
in the remaining months that have passed by his new
service responsibilities, with I do not consider that
it would be equitable to compel them to accept
the change.

3. Forester F.L.Moon's appointment has, as I
