Extract from the Minutes of the 15  
XXXVI<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Concessions  
Committee held on 22<sup>nd</sup> November 1910

(a) Subject I. It was pointed out that, in his despatches of 24th March 1907 regarding the terms in which it is now proposed to grant the Concession to Mr. Parker, the Governor asked that the grant in the former instance of an area within a native reserve should not be taken as a precedent, and the Committee agreed that in the present case the boundary should be so drawn as to exclude the area of the native reserve shown in the map. It was further agreed that provision should be made as to the road, etc. outside the limits.

At this point Mr. Parker, the Concessionaire, took the floor.

He stated that the question of cultivation of Coaxabed had been discussed and the opinion that if the concessionaire intended to grow fire there was no fear of the land becoming exhausted, but it was agreed that the present application was for exploiting and working wild fibre only and that it was therefore necessary to guard against the reckless cutting of fibre.

It was agreed that the word "best" in clause (c) of the proposed contract should be "return".

The question of British Control was raised by Mr. Barnley but it was held that in this case the requirement was unnecessary.
