My Lord,

In continuation of my despatch No. 549 of the 26th instant, I have the honour to make a further recommendation for appointment in the Forestry Department.

2. Mr. C. A. Turpin was appointed a temporary Forester on the 1st December 1908 and has since been decided to dispense with his services. He has been given three months' notice from the 20th September.

3. In this place I would ask Your Lordship to sanction the appointment of Mr. George H. Hanson as Forester on the usual terms with salary of £120 per annum.

4. On reference to my despatch No. 706 of the 11th December 1909 Your Lordship will notice that Mr. Hanson stands in the highest regard of me, and on his recommendation it seems to be most suitable for appointment; he received his forest training at the Forest of Dean School of Forestry and at the Armstrong College, Newcastle.
