I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of a letter to the Secretary and his assistants, Secretaries to the Administration in view of additional work and responsibilities which have fallen upon them since the last seven months.

Mr. Jackson, the Lieutenant Governor, has been absent for the last of the period of his absence for British affairs. During the last three months, and, owing to the delay in filling the vacancy caused by the death of the late Mr. Bell, the staff was further weakened during August and September.

3. In the ordinary course the officer acting for Mr. Jackson would naturally draw an allowance for his services in his capacity while on leave but this has come in, and, though available to the Government, it is not possible to utilize it without special authority.

4. Similarly no one has been wanted to act

for Mr. Hollis and his wife also have fallen upon
the Secretary's salary.

5. The savings on the leave pay of these
officers amounting to £100 would there-
fore ask Your Lordship's sanction for a bonus of
£100 to Mr. Monson and £50 to Mr. Garville, as the
grant of these sums would involve no excess on
the Estimates.

6. I have already expressed the opinion to
Your Lordship that even with its small establish-
ment the Secretariat is understaffed and in addition
when several members are absent the work thrown
on those who remain is exceptionally heavy.

7. I would quote the cases of Messrs. Barton
Wright, Madler and Armstrong, in which bonuses
were allowed although there were no savings on
the salaries of the officers for whom they acted.
