With reference to your letter 19787/1905 of the 1st.
of June, I am directed by the Marquess of Lansdowne to trans-

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 29th. June requesting us to purchase for the British Commissioner on the Anglo-German Boundary Commission (East of Lake Victoria) one sidereal and one meantime ships chronometer.

2. The instruments have been ordered at a total cost of £71.16.4. from Messrs. C. Prodsham and Company and our shipping agents inform us that they will be shipped by the Steamship "Clydesdale" sailing on the 5th. August, due at Mombasa about the 4th. September.

3. Our shipping agents further report that they have made arrangements for the instruments to be kept going dur-
