Sir,

I have the honour to recommend the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 150 to Heri Boheti who, after serving Government for 15 years as a Hospital dresser and lately as a sweeper, has been discharged owing to a mental breakdown.

2. The man's record is a good one and he was formerly in charge of the Native Hospital at Mumias before a Compounder was stationed there. I trust that you will be able to recommend this as a deserving case to the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury.

3. It has been impossible to prepare the requisite pension or gratuity forms for submission to the Lords Commissioners owing to the very meagre information obtainable respecting this man.

4. Similar cases are sure to occur when dealing with old native "menial" staff whose records and service papers are very incomplete, and I would ask
