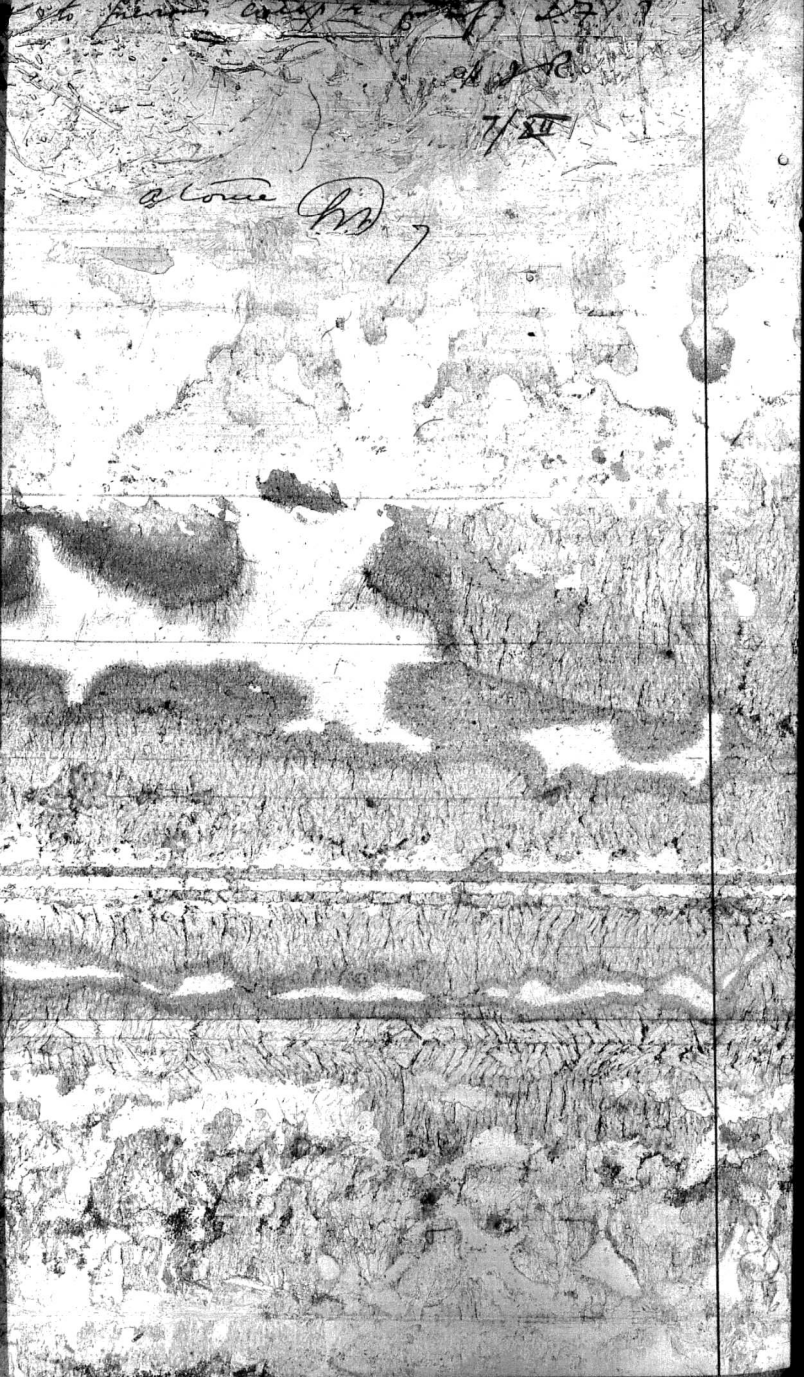

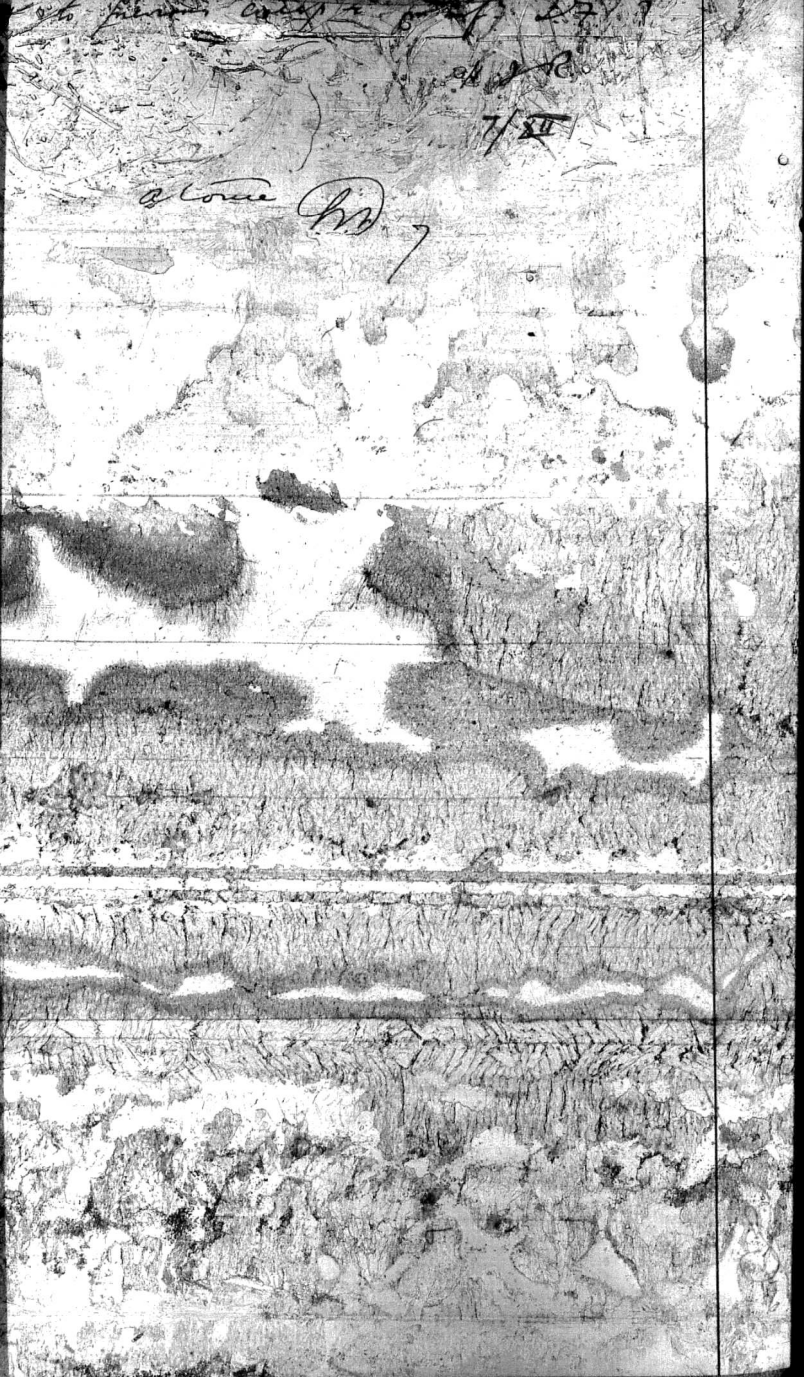

3rd December. Re: your telegram of November 6th Sir Percy Girouard gave permission to the Duchess D'Almeida proceeding to the frontier via Moyale and Bardera. It would appear from your despatch No. 665 November 10th that this course open to objection. Please telegraph explicit instructions as soon as possible if she is to be stopped.
