Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No. 34013/1910 of the 12th November stating that a Constable in the Orange Free State Police is being offered engagement as a 3rd Grade Constable in the East Africa Protectorate Police Force to fill the seventh vacancy.

2. In reply I would point out that we were requested to engage in all eight Constables for service in East Africa, the last vacancy of which we were notified, and which has not been filled, being to replace A. E. Guinnell referred to in your letter No. 1336 E. A. of the 2nd September last as requested, however we are taking no further action in the matter.
