A rising has recently occurred in German East Africa among the Matumbi, a predatory tribe inhabiting the mountains to the North of Kilwa. Some villages on the coast have been attacked & looted, and one German planter & a few Arabs have been killed. It is reported that the Indian traders have escaped. The German troops in two detachments from Kilwa and Tabora are pursuing the insurgents into the hills and have captured and hanged three of the ringleaders. The rising is believed to be of a predatory and local character. Three German officers and seventeen men have been killed, according to a report received to day, but the news is not confirmed, and is not credited by the officials who left Dar-es-Salaam this morning.
