In reply to your letter 22295 of the 26th ultimo relative to Mr. Zaphiro's claim for a subsistence allowance while living at Adis Ababa, I am directed by Secretary Sir E. Grey to state, for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that a special allowance at the rate of Ten shillings a day is made for officers serving in His Majesty's Legation at Adis Ababa, in order to assist them in defraying the heavy cost of living in that place.

With reference to paragraph 3 of your letter under reply, I am to add that the items of the claim put forward by Mr. Zaphiro appear to be reasonable and are such as would be allowed in the case of officers in the employment of the Foreign Office.

Sir:

With reference to my letter of the 28th of June respecting the proposed signature of the Agreement respecting the boundary East and West of Lake Victoria I am directed by Secretary Sir E. Grey to transmit to you herewith to be laid before the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of a letter from the Director of Military Operations on the subject.

The Earl of Crewe will observe that Major General Ewart points out that the boundary West of the Lake cannot be properly described until the Commission which it is proposed to send to M'umboiro has completed its work.

In the circumstances Sir E. Grey would suggest that the signature of the Agreement should be deferred until a definition of the whole boundary is

available
