Sir:-

With reference to previous correspondence and  
with my letter of the 7th instant respecting the  
proposed expedition to British East Africa of Count  
Salm-Saifferscheidt, I am directed by the Secretary  
of State for Foreign Affairs to transmit to you for  
transmission to the Earl of Crewe, the enclosed trans-  
lation of a note from the Austro-Hungarian Ambassador  
from which it appears that Count Salm now proposes to  
start for his expedition from Marseilles on the 4th  
proximo, and to proceed direct to Mombasa. I am  
to enquire whether I should be furnished with letters  
of introduction in favour of Count Salm-Saifferscheidt  
to the authorities of the East Africa Protectorate  
and of Uganda. As regards the question of customs  
facilities Sir E. Grey proposes to reply that the

grant of these depends on the principles enunciated in the last two paragraphs of his note to Count Mandorff of the 7th instant as regards which he awaits further information from His Excellency. I am to enquire whether Lord Crewe concurs in this proposal.
