GERMAN EMERGENCY

December 20th, 1914

Your Excellency:-

The contents of your Excellency's Note No. 41746 of the 22nd ultimo, relative to the properties of the German East Africa Company in Tanganyika have been brought to the knowledge of the parties interested. I have been instructed by the Imperial Government to transmit provisionally to your Excellency the accompanying certified copy of a document to Herr Clemens Dierdorf. Further material has been forwarded by the parties interested and as soon as this is complete and has been examined a further communication will be made by the Imperial Government.

I have also been instructed to call your Excellency's attention to the fact that according to Article 8 of the Anglo-German Colonial Agreement of July 11th, 1900, trading and mineral concessions and rights to real property held by Companies or individuals subjects

subjects of one Power shall be recognized in the affairs of the other Power if their validity is duly established.

Accordingly the question at issue should, in the opinion of the German Government, be decided not from the British side alone but only in agreement with the Imperial Government.
