Your Excellency:-

The contents of your Excellency's Note  
Received of the 2nd ultimo, relative to the operation  
of the German East Africa Colony in Taveta have been  
brought to the knowledge of the parties interested. I  
have been instructing the Imperial Government to im-  
mediately provisionally to Your Excellency the accompany-  
ing certified copy of a document by Herr Siemens  
Dammert. Further material will be forwarded by the  
parties interested and as soon as this is complete and  
has been examined a further communication will be made  
by the Imperial Government.

I have also been instructed to call Your  
Excellency's attention to the fact that according to  
Article 5 of the Anglo-German Colonial Agreement of  
July 1st, 1890, mining and mineral concessions and  
rights to real property held by Companies or individuals  
subject

Subjects of one Power shall be recognized in the spheres  
of the other Power if their validity is duly established.

Accordingly the question at issue should, in the  
opinion of the German Government, be decided not from  
the British side alone but only in agreement with the  
Imperial Government.
